
us busy. But it is better to be busy than lazy in the Lord's field!

***TIMOTHY TEAM
(VOLTA, TOGO,
BENIN DISCIPLESHIP
MEETINGS)***

Apart from a few discipleship and supervisory meetings in the Volta Region, the team's engagements at the CDM Hohoe, Sogakope, Ephrata and Lome Bible Colleges took a greater chunk of our schedule.

However, our Brother Eli and his Benin team had more meeting times. In the same month, he also started a new group of disciples, made up of pupils from one of the mainline disciples' school. Though Eli himself confesses, "It's difficult teaching junior youth", it comes as a tremendous breakthrough in a land such as Benin with its ministry challenges.

Even more refreshing to us is the news of mobilization efforts going on in pursuit of a CDM Bible School in Benin. As at now, the team has contacted 13 brethren who are ready

for a CDM training in Benin.

The Need for a Timothy Team Encounter with the Holy Spirit

After two years of working in the Volta region of Ghana, Togo and Benin, we have come to learn the need for intensive prayer and leadership of the Holy Spirit in discipling.

A critical look at our membership revealed that:

1. Out of the 136 members, only 5 were available to tour the rest of the disciples to strengthen them regularly.

2. Only 32 were actively involved in discipling at their various locations.

3. Another group of 15 are passionate about discipling, but have no disciples to their credit.

4. 60 disciples are very active at meetings but have no disciples, though they have been with us long enough to start reproducing.

5. Finally, 24 disciples are losing interest in the training: some came once a while; others had travelled outside the town or country; and still others were busy with academic work.

Based on the above, we decided to engage members in an intensive prayer festival at zonal levels to awaken the sleeping giant in our fallen soldiers.

Two of these programs were organized: one in Sogakope for the lower Volta zone, and another in Hohoe for the upper volta zone, dubbed "Timothy Team Encounter with the Holy Spirit" or "Encounter" for short.

Do pray with us, as we endeavor with the entire CDM family to reproduce Christlike disciplers.

BOLGATANGA POLYTECHNIC (UPPER EAST REGION)

Two discipleship meetings were organized in Bolgatanga Polytechnic. Our meetings start from 9:00am –11: 00am every Saturday. The facilitator usually leaves Tamale at about 4:30am each Saturday, and it takes an average of 2hr30min - 3hrs to travel to Bolga. A total of twelve (12) GHAFES executives were present for the class. The composure and readiness of the students in Bolgatanga Polytechnic has been encouraging.

NAVRONGO COMMUNITY NURSES TRAINING COLLEGE

A total of three meetings have been held with the Navrongo NTC. We meet every Saturday from 12:00 noon – 2:00pm. An average of 10 people have always been available for meetings. We have discussed Christlikeness, Discipleship, Disciple-Making, New birth and are currently on water baptism. 2 GHAFES executives have agreed to be re-baptised because their initial baptism was wrong. One person who had not been baptized at all will also be receiving baptism for the first time.

UDS – NAVRONGO

Three meetings have been held for UDS-Navrongo GHAFES executives. We discussed Christlikeness, Discipleship, Disciple-making, New birth, Water Baptism, and we will be continuing with Holy Spirit Baptism in our next meeting. A total of nine (9) members are participating in the discipleship class. The UDS Navrongo campus has also been one of the most co-operative groups.

UDS - NYANKPALA CAMPUS

Two meetings have been held with the UDS

Nyankpala Campus. They are ten in number but eight are usually available for class. The students have been very co-operative.

UDS –TAMALE CAMPUS

Four meetings have been organized with the UDS –Tamale Campus. They have finished with the basic bible doctrines. Eight people usually attended the meetings. Discipleship classes have been closed for the Tamale UDS campus so that the students can write their final exams.

TAMALE TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY

Only one meeting has been held for the Tamale Technical University. About Six (6) executive members have always been available for the Class. Tamale Technical University students have not been supportive at all, and are not giving the training the needed attention for real impact. All efforts by the facilitator and his team to address the situation have not proved fruitful.

The grace of God has been sufficient for the meetings organized to train and prepare the Lord's people.

LIKPE MISSIONS DISCIPLESHIP SCHOOL

As part of the CDM vision to disciple the Likpe people in the Volta Region, a three-day workshop on discipleship was held at Likpe Kukurantumi in the Volta Region of Ghana. The program was for church leaders and Christians in the area.

Pastor Mawuli (the head of CDM Goers) was sent to represent the ministry.

He discussed Christlikeness and challenged the audience to stand

for Christlikeness no matter what, before zooming in to discipleship and the teachings on foundations. He used several demonstrations, and a lot of questions were asked. I also taught on the five assurances on the final day, providing discussions and answering questions.

We conducted practicals for the Holy Spirit baptism and deliverance. Also, one lady was water baptized as a result of the teaching of the program.

About 16 adults and a host of young teenagers attended the program. They seemed pleased, and have agreed to a full-fledged Bible School.

I believe that this program has set the tone for mighty things to happen among the Likpe.

The total number of people registered for the retreat was 110, featuring participants across the length and breadth of the upper Volta.

The retreat was very impactful,

and lives have been transformed for Jesus. Some received healing and some were delivered from various forms of oppressions of the devil. Three people people were also water-baptised.

Registration for the Bible School started right at the end of the retreat. In all, 30 students registered for the Bible School, and 5 facilitators were present.

Facilitation, mentoring and practicals caused great impact. 7 people were baptized, and most students received the gift of speaking in

tongues for the first time.

Examinations were also conducted successfully under strict supervision, and 28 out of the 30 participants wrote the papers.

In the end, although the number of the students was quite discouraging, the impact of the school was profound. The students admitted how glad they were that they participated.

This work must be finished, and we will finish it by the Grace of God.

Though she became 60 years on October 6, she does not consider her age an excuse for not turning up for the monthly CDM all-nights in Sogakope and other programs outside her base at Mafi-Kumase.

The April Sogakope retreat was no exemption for Mama Mercy. She was very much in attendance and thanked God she did.

For her, it was a time of revival, bringing her gifts back to life and energizing her childrens' ministry.

CDM LEGON CAMPUS BIBLE COLLEGE

Traditionally, the Campus Bible school was run at Commonwealth Hall. However, attendance has been low. There was therefore the need after the last school held in 2017 to expand access to both students and professionals. After extensive brainstorming, Ideal College was cited as a possible location. This culminated in the very first Bible School at Ideal College.

Main partners included Mr. Cornelius Avudzivi, Mr. Daniel Adansi, Mr Jethro Aidoo and Mr. Jake Commey.

On the average, there were 20 students in attendance for each session. The goal was to equip students with the foundational principles and doctrines, and to encourage students to continue their level 200 and 300 studies at the main Ayi Mensah campus to get the full benefit of the programme.

On the whole, teaching and learning went on successfully for 6 consecutive Saturdays. Each session started with a prayer time at 8:30am and finished at 4pm. Evangelism practicals, Holy Spirit baptism and healing and deliverance

practical sessions were also carried out. Mainline CDM facilitators were available for teaching sessions.

The Legon Campus Bible College was non-residential. Students took care of their own feeding, but facilitators were fed lunch by various sponsoring partners. These arrangements were smooth and did not adversely affect lectures in anyway.

One session was held on site at the CDM Ayi Mensah Campus where students were required to participate in the Annual Quality Control Retreat on 10th

March 2018. During a break out session at the retreat, students were taken through a practical session of how to conduct water baptism. They then were given the opportunity to perform water baptism for some believers.

Examinations were successfully held. 18 students wrote the exams under the supervision of Mr. Jake Commey.

The hope is that some of these students will continue their level 200 and 300 studies to further enhance their knowledge and experience of Jesus.

GHAFES: SOUTHWEST ZONE

Winneba: Fellowships have started and are at various points of completion. We are experiencing the situation where a few people are missing the course, but we seek to resolve that soon. Apart from that, all of the Central, North, South and Ajumako fellowships are doing well.

Cape Coast: Apart from UCC where we have stalled the discipleship since last Saturday, the other fellowships are all having their discipleship classes. In UCC, the current executive

members will be handing over this semester so they have requested that we rather take the incoming executive members through the discipleship programme. We agreed because there is a high level of lack of commitment among the current executive members. Please bear us in prayer.

Takoradi / Tarkwa: The Holy Child fellowship has not started because they are still on vacation. UMaT is going through the discipleship programme. TTU-BU campus is on-going, but the commitment is very low. The TTU-Main are showing no signs of

commitment. I have had the first discussion with their campus head, and I will be calling their president to find out their concerns so we can resolve them with speed.

GHAFES: PENTECOST UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

We meet on Sunday once every two weeks. We've met twice so far. Our first meeting recorded 10 executives. Our second meeting, we had 8 executives with two new faces. So far, we've finished with Christlikeness, and Discipleship and Disciple-making.

They've been receptive

so far. The only challenge is that though we don't start on time because some of them come late, we have to close on time because a majority of them have to attend other meetings after the class.

In our last meeting, all of them shared how the teaching on quiet time and daily prayer has really had an impact on their quiet time.

We will continue with Holy Spirit baptism in our next meeting after a revision of New Birth and Water baptism, since all of them were present at the discipleship workshop at PUC.

GHAFES: UG, LEGON***Undergraduate:***

We've covered Christlikeness, Quiet time, and Holy Spirit baptism. Co-operation is gradually growing as students' interest appears to have risen. I am also scheduling a supplementary class for those who missed some of the meetings.

The main challenges have been inconsistency; limited time; and unfavourable meeting times for facilitators.

Legon Graduate Class:

We met for five times, but there are only 3 consistent people. Others are truant.

GHAFES: CMF FAMILY HEALTH

We have covered introduction, and all four experiences. Practicals were scheduled. Students' co-operation is very encouraging. They always appear enthusiastic and ready to learn.

Obvious transformation is manifesting in most of them, especially with their devotional lives. Only one of them seems to be lagging behind, and appears to need extra attention.

The challenge was that they had to travel to Ayi-Mensah for practicals.

GHAFES: ACCRA TECHNICAL UNIV.

We've met twice so far. I had to go through the need for spiritual growth with them to boost their interest, since their number was not encouraging on the first meeting. I went through Quiet time with them on the second meeting, where they were 8 and seemed much more interested and willing.

Generally, their commitment hasn't been as expected, but I am hopeful for a positive result.

GHAFES: UPSA, LEGON

We met with an average of 10 executives, covering from Christlikeness to Holy Spirit baptism. At first, they were disinterested, but became more enthused for the classes. We had to break because of the exams, but they are anxious for a second session next semester.

GHAFES: VALLEY VIEW & WISCONSIN

Though attendance has been low, interest and commitment is growing. 2 from Valley View were baptised with water and the Holy Spirit.


Broadly categorized, our expenses fell into ten major categories.
