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# EDITOR'S NOTE

## REPENTANCE, NOT RESILIENCE

**W**hen the world was thrown into chaos by COVID-19, I was immediately reminded of the book of Joel. When there is utter disaster and calamity, God welcomes the nations to petition Him. He is ready to be entreated. Ever the call from heaven is to repent and return to the Lord.

Jesus expressed this same heart in Luke 13, when He was confronted with the reality of disaster in our broken world: both accidental and intentional. His only response was, "... unless you repent, you will all likewise perish." (Lk. 13:3,5).

When trouble knocks on our doors as individuals, families, nations, or even the whole world, God desires repentance not resilience. He is not expecting us to be strong, to gather ourselves together, figure out solutions, and present backup plans. When there is disaster, God is not interested in resilience: He is calling for our repentance.

This is what the Christlike Disciplemakers Movement has dedicated itself to for all these years. We have been working towards the repentance not only of unbelievers outside the Church, but also of those who are in the Kingdom but are living as though they are not.

The events of this turbulent year have reminded us all of the urgency of bringing men to repentance according to the

Father's heart. Finishing the task of world evangelism is not optional. Neither is the uphill task of striving to be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ, and making disciples who can also make disciples in order to reach unfathomable corners of the world. Our commitment to being the light in our schools, offices, and neighbourhoods cannot flag, and the need to minister to the poor and needy as Christ Himself does remains necessary.

In this report, we outline some of the major activities that we have been engaged in across the globe. We are aware that there is so much more that God is doing through the people who have been a part of our retreats, our Bible schools, our discipleship groups, ministry academies, and other CDM programmes. We recognize the faithful commitment of all our facilitators, financiers, and partners in strategy, prayer, support, and encouragement. We truly appreciate your labour, but we cannot be so busy congratulating ourselves that we leave the work undone.

The world may get tougher, but God's purpose is unchanging. More than ever before, the battle for human souls has been raging. Over a million people have died from COVID-19, and the world as we know it has been reshaped.

Even now, let us be reminded of Christ's most solemn words:

*"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."* **Matt. 28:19-20.**

There is no greater message on our hearts than those of the Holy Spirit through Apostle Paul:

*We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people... in the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world—just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace.*

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

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# A MESSAGE FROM THE FOUNDER

FROM CORONAVIRUS TO URGENCY



## HIGHLIGHTS

We thank God for taking us through this COVID year. Apart from the many blessings He has poured on our activities, He has also opened new doors for online ministry, and taught us valuable lessons for ministry of every kind. Our facilitators are also well, and growing from strength to strength.

**F**inally, finally, 2020 has ended. What a year!! A new normal. CDM has had tumultuous months fulfilling the task of discipling the nations with face masks, social distancing, elbow-greeting, and handwashing culture.

We bless the Lord for the successful week-long January Bible College and the weekend Quality Control February Retreat on “Systems and Online Ministry”. COVID-19 made every other program for the year a fiasco, until the three Online Bible College sessions broke through. We are proud of Aseda, Miquifire and his team, the Media Team, and the Administration Team for setting up this first-ever E-CDMBC.

Even the annual retreat was squeezed into a 3-day meeting for some handpicked fivefold ministry leaders under the observation of strict COVID-19 protocols. We give glory to God in all these. It could have been worse.

Then our All-Night/All-Day Prayer Army. When we saw that the COVID-19 had stopped our once-a-month Friday all-night prayer meetings for world evangelism, we resorted to online praying. God used our Brother Louis Tawam and his team to

begin what is fueling the work now in leaps and bounds. Can you see the anointing increase in CDM? We wish to express our gratitude to God for these gallant soldiers who have been praying faithfully to see this task finished. We even see people praying not only from Ghana, but also from the UK, USA, and South Africa. and we are humbled. All glory to His matchless name.

We also thank God for the face-to-face satellite Bible Colleges that ended the year: Krachi Nkwanta, Dambai, Ho, Sogakofe - all in the Volta/Oti Region, and Zebilla and Wa in the Upper East and Upper West Regions. How can we appreciate all the facilitators, especially Pastors Selassie Mawuenyega, Seth Kunkpe, Delali Adzah, Solomon Wosodor, Prosper Chapu, Louis Tawam, and Grace Adamu who served in more than one session? Thank you and God bless you.

We cannot forget the CDM financiers, led by Cornelius Avudzivi and his team. They have been so faithful that we did not have to go anywhere for funding for the Bible Colleges, NASPIM, the retreats, and other administrative costs. We say a big “AYEKOO”! May God continue to fill your

vessels with abundant oil. It is more blessed to give than to receive, Acts 20:35.

Are there other shouts of triumph for 2020? Sure. CDM had an online retreat in Germiston, South Africa, when God graced our brother Mawuli Adadey, a PhD student in Genetic Engineering with disciples and baptisms there. Two of them even joined the E-CDMBC. Another PhD team in Denmark, Shelter and Irene Teyi, informed us that -- among other testimonies -- their local disciples have baptized their first disciple.

Meanwhile, our Brother Julius Hagan has just finished his studies at Wheaton College, Illinois, and Kelvin has been moved by the Lord to Europe for further studies. In Ghana, too, many of our facilitators have seen God's blessings as they advance their academic careers. How good He has been to us!

We have also been holding weekly Zoom meetings for CDM Europe and CDM South Africa on Wednesdays and Saturdays respectively. It is a blessing to watch God continue His work even while the whole world has been down.

Again, we bless God for the Ghana National Service Personnel in Ministry (NASPIM). One of their number, our sister Grace Adamu, has started a local church in Navrongo. Apostolic. Many more. Praise God.

I have personally learnt unforgettable lessons from the coronavirus shutdowns and lockdowns. My primary lesson is that *we move among mortals who can die anytime and be ushered to eternity*. Death is certain, so judgment is also certain (Heb. 9:27). The gospel cannot wait.

Also, I saw countries that considered themselves very ready for health emergencies crumbling, and I understood that *man does not live by his strength, wisdom or science*. God is sovereign. Who could have believed that Africa of all the continents

would be spared from the tragedies linked with COVID-19 elsewhere?

Thirdly, I have been rudely awakened to *the real state of God's church*. Many believers are shallow, naked, and unprepared for Christ's second coming. Churches built on programs and events without discipleship have still not recovered from the lockdown. We can never go back to ministering as superficially as we were before the coronavirus. I must not waste time. Accountability for the flock is real (Heb. 13:7,17).

Lastly, *the online ministry*. Discipling online, teaching and counseling sessions online, and Zoom meetings have become the new normal, and have expanded ministry beyond my wildest imaginations. No country is closed now. No individual is beyond reach. There is no excuse.

What do we foresee in the year 2021? Urgency, Urgency, URGENCY. The darkness is creeping on us. Freedom of conscience is narrowing. Political instability is increasing. Morals are crumbling, LGBTQ is running, absolute truth is thinning, Islam is growing, God's grace upon Africa is multiplying, the harvest is crying, churches are withering, and Christlike disciplinators are calling. Where are you? What can you offer?

*I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ, who will judge the living and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom: Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching.*

## HIGHLIGHTS

This year, there were a total of eleven (11) CDMBC Sessions:

- one (1) residential session at the Ayi-Mensah headquarters,
- three (3) sessions of the online Bible College (E-CDMBC), and
- seven (7) sessions of various Satellite and Missions CDMBCs

CDM Bible College is an interdenominational institution that aims to produce Christlike disciple-makers who know their specific calling from God and have enough urgency for the Great Commission to reproduce strategic and faithful disciple-makers who will be labourers for finishing the Unfinished Task within our generation. We seek to teach, train and build Christlike character and reproducible but biblical models in our generation.

The Certificate Course is made up of three (3) Residential modules, each lasting a week at a residential session, or two weeks online. Our accredited courses are structured into four main departments, headed by Senior Facilitators who oversee Facilitators and Teaching Assistants.

We offer a number of program options depending on location and availability:

- Residential Main CDMBC Sessions
- Online Bible College (E-CDMBC)
- Satellite CDMBC Campuses

We covet your prayers for *consistent impact* in each session of the CDM Bible College, as well as for *Christlikeness and character transformation* as

# NORTHERN ZONE

## CDMBC TATALE

God being so good, a CDMBC session was successfully organized in Tatale from 30th December 2019 to 5th January, 2020.

This was done to equip the saints in order for them to respond to the Master's command in Matt. 28:19-20 and Apostle Paul's in 2 Tim. 2:2.

In this report, we present a brief overview of attendance, activities, and some of our major challenges.

### *Attendance*

By God's grace, we recorded an attendance of sixty-four (64) students. We were also blessed to have four (4) facilitators and five (5) others supporting them.

### *Activities*

As with all other residential CDMBC sessions, our days began with dawn prayers and ended with prayer sessions and practical ministrations.

Five (5) students were water baptized. All the students, especially the Level 100s, received the Holy Spirit baptism. Healing and Deliverance ministration was also done for the entire student body. All oppressed were set free with the help of the Holy Spirit.

The Level 100s also went out for practical evangelism, during which forty-five (45) people gave their lives to Christ.



### *Remarks*

Aside honouring and admiration of our mighty Father without whom no success could be mentioned, the leadership of CDMBC Tatale acknowledge all our partners in prayer, finance, and all other kinds of support. We really bless God for how He is using the leadership of CDM to administer such impact to us. In fact, we say that without you, we could not chalk any success. May the good Lord empower you beyond your imagination.

We encountered a number of challenges, but some of the most remarkable were:

**Accommodation** Paster Malintiba Dominic's house harboured the students but it had inadequate rooms. Due to that, some students slept in the classrooms, so we had to keep packing up the furniture after classes, and rearrange them the following day before classes could begin. Pray with us that God will provide a venue for accommodation with sufficient sleeping places to host all the students.

**Transportation of the needy students.** Some students are willing to attend the Bible school, but find it difficult to transport themselves to the venue due to distance involved. The leaders in their effort to finding solutions to this challenge resulted in hiring a motor tricycle to convey the students. However, the charges of the tricycle riders were so



exorbitant that it was a real challenge. Pray with us that God will provide us with a wiser solution to this issue.

## CDMBC ZEBILLA

The maiden CDMBC Zebilla session was held from 27th September to 3rd October 2020.

There were thirty-five (35) people who participated as students. Out of these, thirty-four were fully engaged and wrote the final examinations.

During the session, twelve (12) students were baptized by immersion. We were also glad to have seven (7) of the National Service Personnel in Missions (NASPIM) candidates for the 2020/2021 year join the session for training. One of our female students completed her Bible summary in six months after her experience in CDMBC Tamale. It is amazing to see the impact in people's lives.

We are thankful to God for the five facilitators He provided us with, and we here acknowledge Mr. Emmanuel Addo,

who refreshed these facilitators to their great joy.

In line with CDM's particular emphasis on reaching unreached tribes in Ghana, we thank God that we had a number of different tribes represented at the CDMBC Zebilla:

- Bissa
- Bulsa
- Kusasi
- Frafra
- Kassena
- Talansi
- Kokomba
- Ga
- Fante

We believe that God will use them to begin transforming their friends, families, and tribes.

Please pray with us that the students who were a part of the session will truly be transformed and agents of transformation in the various schools and places they find themselves. Pray also for the NASPIM who were trained, that they will be more effective on the field as they serve with CDM.

## CDMBC WA

*We then as workers together with him beseech you also that you receive not the grace of God in vain. 2 Cor. 6:1*

God being so good, CDMBC Wa was held from the 9th to 14th November, 2020. Five (5) facilitators were present to teach a total of seventeen (17) students.

Teaching and learning began on the Monday and ended on the Friday. Teaching was conducted in the English language only since all our audience were students and could understand the English language. Teaching went on very well by God's grace throughout the period.

There were no water baptisms during the session as all participants had been properly baptized by immersion. There was a ministration of the Holy Spirit baptism, and He moved mightily as some students spoke in tongues and others prophesied. The Healing and Deliverance ministration was also held, and God set all the students free.

Examinations were successfully conducted on Saturday, and during the closing ceremony of the session, all the students pledged to make at least one disciple.

Some of our greatest challenges were that:

- Some students disappointed the organizers, because they did not show up even though they had promised to.
- Some parents also interrupted the session by requiring their children to leave off studies to go and work sometimes.

# VOLTA + OTI (VOLTI) ZONE

## CDMBC DAMBAI+KRACHIE

CDMBC Dambai was held from 2nd to 9th November, 2020. It was held in conjunction with what would have been CDMBC Krachie, so the students and facilitators from Krachie were moved to join the Dambai group, in order to prevent duplication of resources.

There were a total of sixty-two (62) students, comprising fifty-five (55) in Level 100, three (3) in Level 200, and four (4) in Level 300. All 62 students participated in the examination of the Session. Three (3) students took oral exams while the rest took the written one.

During the Session, water baptism was held, and eighteen (18) out of the 55 Level 100 students were baptised. We also administered

deliverance and Holy Spirit baptism ministrations. To the glory of God, all the students were filled with the Spirit and delivered. Level 100s could also be sent out for practical evangelism.

We are immensely grateful to God for all the facilitators, assistants, and organizing volunteers who were able to join us for the Session.

## CDMBC SOGAKOPE

CDMBC Sogakope was held from 9th November, 2020 to 14th November, 2020. We had forty (40) students in total, out of which were thirty males and ten females. God blessed us with very strong facilitators and teaching assistants this year.

Thirty-eight (38) students out of forty were able to take the exam successfully. For the Level 100s, 27 out of 28 took the exam; 2 out of 2 Level 200s; and 9 out of 10 Level 300s.

As at CDMBC Sessions, the practical sessions were also held. Water baptism was ministered on Thursday, and four students were baptized while the others used the opportunity to learn how to conduct baptism. The Holy Spirit baptism and Healing and Deliverance ministrations were also effectively conducted. We bless God for the ministry of Pastor Selassie Mawuenyega and Rev. Solomon Wosordo-Kpodo. Students were also able to go out for practical evangelism, and reported two souls won.

We thank God for seeing us through the session. Some of the challenges we faced included the following:

- Many students did not pay for their registration, so we relied heavily on finance from the CDM Headquarters
- Many of the previous Level 100 students who would have been in Level 200 did not show up.
- Some churches and students who registered their participation before the Session did not finally show up, and this affected our attendance levels.

Some students recommended that sermon preparation should be included as a course in the CDM Bible College, especially for those who are church workers.

### **Conclusion**

The Lower Volta Team deem it a great joy to serve, and want to thank the CDM headquarters and all our financiers for the financial support. We are also grateful to the gallant facilitators who were present at the session.

The entire student body and pastors from various churches in the area salute CDM for such a wonderful impartation.

Even though we faced all kinds of challenges, the Bible School was very powerful and successful. There is hope for future Bible Schools in the Lower Volta (Sogakope). We are grateful to the almighty God for His empowerment.



## CDMBC NKWANTA

CDMBC Nkwanta came off successfully from 20th September to 26th September, 2020. By the first night, we had about forty (40) students who had arrived. This has been the highest turn up so far among the three sessions of CDMBC we have hosted in Nkwanta.

There were twenty-three (23) Level 100s, six (6) Level 200s, and ten (10) Level 300s. We are especially pleased that our students came from several towns and villages in the area:

- Breweniase
- Dambai
- Kpassa
- Ashiabre
- Pawa
- Kue
- Gerkrone
- Sibi

During the practicals session, a total of thirteen (13) Level 100s were baptized by immersion.

To the glory of God, CDMBC Nkwanta ended successfully yesterday with a well conducted examination. All students sat for the exams: those who could write took the written exams, whilst the others took the oral exams.

We are grateful for your prayers and financial support.

## CDMBC HO

Though the CDM Bible College's trainings in the Volta region date as far back as 2015, it was not until April 2019 that Ho, the regional capital, had a share of the trainings. Under the leadership of Dr. Majeste Kouame, the Ho CDM Bible College center has seen three Bible School sessions, the just-ended session being the third in succession.

With disciplinmaking as a focal point, the CDMBC Ho organizing team endeavored to enforce post-Bible School disciplinship as a system for recruiting trained workers for CDM in Ho and the entire CDM Volti sub-region.

But little success has been chalked over the two years of diligence at this, owing to the lack of enough disciplinmakers to shoulder the workload.

While this is true, it is worth noting that Dr. Kouame and Christian Amu, a Sogakope-based disciple, have been very instrumental in keeping some of the students from the first two sessions faithful to CDM and the cause of Christlike Disciplinmaking. Products from their disciplinship initiatives have proven to be the bedrock of the just-ended session.

We observed that the breakdown of disciplinship work in the town affected the numbers that showed up for this year's training, particularly in the 2nd and 3rd year classes. We had a woeful turn up of 6 students for Level 200, while the final year class recorded only 3 students. That notwithstanding, the Level 100 class of 17 students looked impressive with a team of young people and good-spirited adult students. This gave us a total of twenty-six (26) students for the Session.

### *Facilitators*

As part of the Volti team's initiative of recruiting local facilitators and giving them opportunity to grow, we endeavor at all trainings to have more indigenous Volta and Oti based CDM facilitators handling the trainings. In the just-ended training, we had Florence Kumah, a teacher based in Alavanyo, GSK Agbo and Delali Adzah to handle EM, DS and CS respectively.

Our ever-supportive senior facilitators from Accra, Pastors GHK Apreku and Selassie Mawuenyega, were also available to give the training a touch of maturity.

### *Accommodation and Feeding*

Since 21 out of the total 26 students were non-resident, we allowed students to cater for their own feeding.

Facilitators, on the other hand, lodged in a residence about 10 minutes drive from the premises





of the training center, meaning facilitators had to shuffle to the training center each morning and back home every evening, thus incurring an additional cost.

### *Teaching and Learning*

Teaching was intertwined with prayers at break periods to give students, who were predominantly non-resident, a feel of the CDM residential session.

There was evidence of understanding and growing interest in the teachings as the days passed by.

Our mentoring periods were very exciting – so much so that the students who wanted to run home as soon as class was over, stayed even past 6:30pm in some of the groups, asking questions and listening to the facilitators answer.

### *Ministrations*

Practical sessions were held, along with opportunity for students to have practical experience of the

things they learned in class.

**Water Baptism:** Out of the 17-man Level 100 class, only 3 were not properly baptized. These were baptized and others were given opportunities to practice baptism.

**Holy Spirit Baptism:** All the Level 100 students were filled with the Spirit and spoke in tongues to the glory of God after the ministration.

**Deliverance Ministration:** Deliverance was administered to all, particularly the Level 100 students.

**Prayer:** Since a majority of the students were not in residence, we had to make space for prayer during the day. The first prayer time was for 30 minutes in the morning, before classes began. Then we prayed 15 minutes during a short break during classes. Finally, we prayed for another 15 minutes after the last class but before the mentoring time.

## Examinations

All students conducted themselves in an orderly manner and there were no malpractices. Out of the 26-man student population, only one student was unavailable for the examinations.

Except for Levels 200 and 300 EM, our hardworking facilitators did well to mark, record and hand to the registrar (Rev. GHK Apreku) the score sheets of all the papers written before the school officially closed at 6pm on Saturday, the 28th of November, 2020.

### *The Future of CDM Ho*

Lessons from Dr. Kouame and Christian Amu have taught us to engage the current team of students and build around them the necessary structures for continuity. We have therefore roped them in for our fortnightly discipleship classes, with our first meeting scheduled for Saturday, 12th December, 2020.

As a team, we'd like to express our profound gratitude to the CDM Financiers, the facilitators, our host and the entire CDM family for their unflinching support.



# GREATER ACCRA ZONE

## CDMBC AYI-MENSAH

CDMBC Ayi-Mensah is scheduled to be held every January, July, and August. In 2020, the January session of the School was held successfully from 27th January, 2020 to 2nd February, 2020.

Both the Certificate course and Advanced Diploma course were ran concurrently. In sum, there were one hundred and thirty-two students, comprising:

- Level 100A -- 70
- Level 200 -- 25
- Level 300 -- 20
- Diploma -- 17

This included two students from Cote D'Ivoire.

We bless God for how smoothly the session went, including the practical sessions, mentoring times, teaching and learning, and the Sunday morning service.

Please continue to pray with us, *for more and more impact in the lives of students*. Pray that the *increasing numbers of students will not reduce the quality and commitment of CDM to Christlikeness, discipleship, and world evangelism*. Pray for all our facilitators and assistants, *for replenishment of every virtue and more blessings in their lives*.

## ONLINE CDMBC (E-CDMBC)

After the COVID-19 hit Ghana in March 2020, it appeared impossible for any sessions of CDM Bible College to be held in 2020; however, this was only God's way of doing something new.

*See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. Isa. 43:19*

Indeed, this was the opening God used to help the CDM Bible College go online. After discussions and consultations with a core team led by Aseda Mensah, an E-CDMBC session was proposed.

It was quite challenging deciding how to digitize the key aspects of a CDM Bible College in order for students to be as impacted as they are during the face-to-face sessions. By the grace of God, however, the E-CDMBC Planning Team was able to draw up a programme that would be a starting point.

The first E-CDMBC session was held in May 2020, and the response was overwhelmingly positive. Students from eight (8) different countries were able to participate, thus demonstrating how online tools can facilitate the goal of CDM to reach the whole



world with the gospel. The second session was then held in June 2020, following heightened interest from both new and continuing students. This was again a successful session. A final session for the 2020 year was held in October 2020.

The platform for the session was changed from Google Meet and Google Classroom, to Microsoft Teams, to further improve the teaching and learning experience for all those involved.

We are truly grateful to God for the opportunity He provided for us to begin a new stream of CDM Bible College. We are also immensely thankful to the various CDMBC facilitators, led and coordinated by their sacrificial heads of departments. We appreciate the labour of all those who worked backstage to ensure that everything ran smoothly, especially the E-CDMBC Planning Team.

In running these online sessions, the team came across some unique positives as well as some challenges that are worth noting.

#### *Advantages of the Online Sessions*

1. **Increased Reach:** It was gratifying to see how many different people could participate in the CDMBC sessions. With the face-to-face sessions, even with the satellite BCs, it was practically impossible for those outside the country to join the sessions. However, for the first time, CDMBC was able to serve disciples and friends who have also travelled outside the country.
2. **Minimal Cost:** Because the overhead costs were greatly reduced, CDM only had to make provision for the data of facilitators. This allowed us to charge a minimal cost to participating students, and helped us to cross barriers that used to prevent participants from starting or continuing CDMBC. Although students had to make provision for their own data in order to follow the classes and complete assignments, the overall burden on students was still less than they would have had to pay.
3. **Provision for Continuing Students:** An unexpected advantage of the E-CDMBC was also that many continuing students who had to give up on the CDMBC programme because they had relocated or were not able to join the face-to-face sessions were able to participate online and complete their course. Indeed, in the second session of the E-CDMBC, we had a greater number of continuing students than

Level 100s, which was a first in the history of CDMBC at the Main Campus.

4. **Marking of Scripts:** One of the greatest challenges faced by the face-to-face sessions was the marking of scripts. Exhausted facilitators were not often able to grade all the assignments and exam scripts given throughout the week. It was therefore difficult to compile and distribute the grades of students in good time so that they could monitor their progress and performance. With E-CDMBC, however, most departments were able to digitize their exams and have the marks ready for students within a reasonable amount of time. Students also got notifications of their results within the platform, and could discuss further with facilitators about any challenges they might have. This also facilitated the work of the Registrar, as he could now get all the necessary grades for the Accreditation body.
5. **Implementation of Discipleship:** Finally, the E-CDMBC helped in some measure to improve CDMBC's goal of getting each student in an effective discipleship relationship. Many students were assigned to disciplemakers, and though not all such allocations were equally effective, we do have some success stories that show that we are on the right track if we keep working at it.

#### *Challenges of the Online Sessions*

We however faced the following challenges:

1. **Limited Active Participation:** Unlike with the face-to-face session where students can be seen by facilitators and it is easier to ensure that everyone is paying attention and following along, we had some challenges with students who either would not log in for some classes, or would log in but not be participating in the class. Especially in the Level 100 class of E-CDMBC3, we realized that many people were irregular in attendance and this was challenging to the facilitators and administrators. We need to find a wisdom that will help students to commit to the two weeks of classes without allowing themselves to be distracted.
2. **Limited Impact:** Though the Planning Team tried very hard to distill the key elements of a CDMBC into the online session, it is agreed among stakeholders that the impact of the E-CDMBC was not comparable to that of the

face-to-face session. This was in part due to some students not participating as expected, but also because we were not able to hold intensive and extended prayer sessions, the fasting period on Thursday, daily mentoring sessions, and the hands-on practical sessions. We still need a wisdom that will help students to benefit from all these experiences in order to whip up their spiritual lives. CDMBC must never be reduced to head knowledge alone, or it defeats its entire purpose.

**3. Complaints about Time:** A number of requests were also made by students for recordings of various sessions so that those who missed classes could catch up later. It was argued that spending all day for two weeks online was untenable, so some students could not fully participate even though they registered for the session. The E-CDMBC Planning Team is looking into expanding the online session by offering an asynchronous E-CDMBC session, which would allow students to log in at their own convenience to follow the classes and assignments.

#### *The Way Forward for E-CDMBC*

E-CDMBC has come to stay. Every year, Godwilling, there will be an online session in March, June, and October. As we continue tweaking the E-CDMBC to heighten the impact and effectiveness of the programme, here are our recommendations for the future:

- Develop a more stable database of mentors and disciplinators so that every online student can have someone personally checking up on their spiritual growth
- Plan a better way of enabling online students to have practical ministrations of water baptism, Holy Spirit baptism, and healing and deliverance.
- Roll out an asynchronous version of the E-CDMBC programme so that those who cannot follow our timetable can have access to learn at their own convenience
- Hold a CDMBC webinar which will feature an overview of CDM Bible College so that all students are well-informed about the requirements of participating in the Sessions

#### *Prayer Topics for CDMBCs*

While we recognize how much work God is doing

in the lives of students of CDMBC all over the world, we need more prayer. Join us to petition God for the following:

- Pray for the leadership of CDM, that God will grant more wisdom as to strategic ways of improving CDMBCs on the large scale
- Pray that CDMBC will not be about head knowledge, but that there will be visible character transformation in the life of each student
- Pray for more alumni to be committed to helping at CDMBCs by being mentors and disciplinators
- Pray for more students to graduate by reading through their Bibles, completing a project work, and working on a disciple
- Pray for all the satellite CDMBC campuses, that the Gospel will spread further in every locality where a CDMBC session is held

## CDMBC GRADUATION

The CDMBC Graduation Ceremony was held at the CDM Retreat Center on Saturday, 5th September, 2020. All COVID-19 protocols were observed to ensure that everyone was kept safe.

The Ceremony was also livestreamed on the CDM Facebook page, so that more people could participate than those who were present in person at the CDM Retreat Centre.

## HIGHLIGHTS

CDM South Africa was able to host an online retreat simultaneously with an in-person CDM Akosombo retreat. The Major August retreat came off successfully, and was broadcasted to a much broader audience than we could have hoped for. CDM is also learning to adapt to digital opportunities for ministry.

The Akosombo Satellite Retreat was a one-day intensive retreat which was held on the 25th of January, 2020 at the VRA JHS complex in Akosombo. The chief disciplemaker who helped to make this happen was Tawam Louis Ndinyun.

The core planning team of the retreat was headed by Mr Alex Charles Dankwa and heavily supported by Mrs. Okaibea Mante and Mrs Lucy Dankwa. There were also other very hard working disciples who contributed to making the programme a resounding success. In total, there were seventy (70) participants drawn mostly from the Akosombo area and about 7 disciples from Mampong Akuapem.

The event was planned side by side with the CDM South Africa Retreat. We thank God for the life of Aps. JFK Mensah who gave about six different talks that day, three at the Akosombo retreat face-to-face, and three online to the CDM SA group.

We believe that the retreat was very successful as members shared the vision of CDM and discussed the interdenominational approach of CDM towards world evangelism and disciplmaking. After plenary talks by Apostle JFK Mensah, we broke out into small groups to discuss why disciplmaking and

disciplmaking were so critical for every Christian.

We are glad to share that the entire programme was sponsored by the Akosombo disciples. The venue was graciously given to us for free by a disciple of one of the Akosombo disciples who happened to be the pastor of the newly established Perez Chapel in Akosombo. They also served lunch and ensured that all participants were well-catered for.

We were blessed to hear testimonies of how disciplmaking was happening in the region and we were glad to see that the programme attracted other people who were not in CDM, but knew Aps. JFK Mensah and were interested in whatever he had to teach.

After the retreat, they were able to retain some people who expressed interest in becoming disciples because of all that was discussed at the event.

## *Challenges*

Unfortunately, there were a few challenges.

The first and actually most disturbing was the fact that many churches did not want their members to participate because they felt suspicious. They thought we were going to steal or poach their

members. This made it such that they could not effectively advertise the programme and could not allow their members to attend.

The second major challenge was with the number of people we were able to retain at the end of the event to join the discipleship programme. Though a few were able to join, many more could have joined.

We believe that the last challenge -- the challenge of COVID-19, which started just shortly after the event -- contributed to the second challenge. This is because, shortly after the program, there was a national lockdown and a lot of movement was restricted. This made it such that they could not go out effectively to reach the retreat participants and encourage them to join in the discipleship meetings.

Having said all these, we are proud that the Akosombo Satellite

Retreat was the first Ghanaian satellite retreat to take off for the 2020 year, and it gave us a lot of encouragement to see that great work is happening on the ground which we did not even recognize at the national level because many of those disciples were not usually at our CDM retreats.

We bless God for the lives of the organisers, especially Louis Tawam. We bless the donors and funders. We bless everybody who contributed in anyway to make it such a success.

## CDM MAJOR RETREAT 2020



### ONLINE DISCIPLESHIP MEETINGS

### FACILITATOR TRAINING WORKSHOP

In 2019, for the first time, a Facilitator Training session was held in Accra. Although it was planned for this event to be held annually in order to invite and

educate interested persons to join the core group of facilitators, it could not come on this year.

### PRAYER FESTIVAL

Prayer is an indispensable part of what we do as CDM. The Annual Prayerfest could not come on this year due to COVID-19.

### MINISTRY ACADEMY

The CDM Ministry Academy is a deeply impactful programme for helping participants to identify and develop their various ministry gifts.

It could not come on this year due to COVID-19.

## CDM SOUTH AFRICA

The theme for the CDM South Africa retreat which came off from 24th January to 26th January, 2020 was simply, "Jesus".

Help us thank God for His mercies and kindness. His works are mighty and beyond the understanding of men.

I arrived on Thursday 23rd of January, and had separate discipleship classes with three (3) of the disciples before the retreat. Two of these were on the Assurances stage, and one was on the Foundation stage. We shopped on Thursday for the retreat and cooked on Friday.

The retreat started on Friday evening with 7 adults and 3 children, with one facilitator in attendance. We had video calls from the UK and the USA, from which testimonies and words of encouragement were shared by Pastor Freeman and Brother Julius Hagan. It was encouraging to hear these testimonies. We however, faced technical challenges with the second video call. There were

prayers after the testimonies and that was the closure of the first day.

Saturday was fully packed with plenary talks from Ghana, discussions after the sermons, and spiritual growth clinics. The main talks were given by Rev. JFK Mensah. We thank God for empowering him to preach to us multiple times as he preached separately to the brethren in Akosombo as well.

After each sermon, we made sure to have a discussion to ensure the maximum understanding of the topic handled. The participants were allowed to ask questions and also contribute their knowledge to answering some of the questions.

In between the talks, also, we held spiritual growth clinics. Because about 50% of the participants were not in any CDM discipleship program, I had to teach on each topic for the clinic after which the participant's needs were examined for each stage. The spiritual growth clinics held were

1) New Birth 2) Water Baptism and 3) Holy Spirit Baptism. We had breakfast, a couple of snack breaks, and lunch served at the retreat.

Sunday was also an awesome day. We had the farewell message from Rev JFK Mensah, after which we had our Sunday school (Bible Study) on “How to Have Your Personal Quiet Time”. There was lunch after church and practicals of water baptism.

There is always a challenge to get a place for water baptism at Germiston. We moved from swimming pool to swimming pool in search for water to carry out the baptism, and finally got one at a guest house. We also held a deliverance ministration after the baptism till about 8pm.

Monday was the final day where we handled the leftover cases. We are extremely grateful to God for His presence. In all, four (4) people prayed to receive Christ/rededicate their lives to Christ. Three out of the four were water baptized and all four were prayed for, for Holy Spirit Baptism.

### *Further Updates*

During the COVID-19 months, CDM South Africa has also been able to have regular online meetings on Skype with Rev. JFK Mensah. He has addressed various contemporary issues, answering some of the common but key questions that many people have about Christianity.

We are also thankful to God that two (2) of the CDM SA disciples were able to participate in the E-CDMBC. This was a great answer to prayer, and we believe that God is really on the move in this country.

Our profound gratitude to the CDM leadership, partners, and all those who have remembered us in prayer. We entreat you to keep supporting us in your hearts and



connecting your networks so that CDM SA can grow stronger and stronger.

## CDM DENMARK

### *Our Work So Far*

This year 2020 presented the opportunity for us to make 2 new disciples in Denmark. Their names are Emma Gaffron and Petya Dimitrova.

We started our first discipleship meeting in May 2020 during the lockdown. It started with one disciple (Emma), and when we got to Holy Spirit Baptism, she told her very good friend, Petya, about the discipleship classes. Petya was very eager to join the discipleship.


Emma is from Denmark, while Petya is from Bulgaria but resides in Denmark. When Petya joined, we had to start the lessons over again which gave the opportunity for our first disciple to also review what she had learnt previously. We meet every week if everyone's schedule permits. Our meetings are online via Zoom or in-person in our home and are between 1.5 to 2 hours.

Our disciples are very interested in memorizing Bible verses. So, after each meeting we give them Bible verses relating to the next topic to memorize. The Roman Road is among some of the Bible verses they have memorized. In addition, we give them Bible passages to study and make a presentation for the next meeting. We typically break down each topic into 3 separate sessions so that we can go into details and address issues they may have.

On 20th December, 2020 our disciples had a practical experience of water baptizing a friend, Roxana, who has accepted Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Roxana wants Emma to teach her and Emma has started an informal discipleship and is sharing some of what she has learnt with Roxana.

### *Our Lessons and Observations*

- Although Denmark is highly individualistic, people appreciate it when you show genuine concern in them. Irene has been reaching out to many people in the local church for many months. So, it was quite easy for our first disciple to be excited about the discipleship.
- People appreciate a deep knowledge of God and His Word coupled with humility. We have come to learn that serving in any way possible in the church tends to open the hearts of men to your ministry.
- Bible Mastery is a key asset that always counts.
- The ability to focus on the content and structure of Disciplemaking as outlined in the CDM manual,

and structuring each meeting in a way that can make room for the needs of the disciples is vital. In our meetings, we teach on the preparatory or foundation stage and answer questions. In some meetings, our disciples just present and receive feedback. In other meetings, we just have dinner and talk about our personal journey in Christ.

- To reach out to the rest of the world, it is important to join a church or Christian community that has more of the natives or other nationals instead of a church which has only members of your own nationality.
- Although Europe is a more difficult ground compared to Ghana, there are people here who are still hungry for God. We are grateful to God for bringing these people our way and it is our prayer that He continues to bring in more people.
- The weekly CDM Europe online meetings with Apostle JFK Mensah has been a source of insight into God's word and a tool for answering our questions. It has also provided the platform for us to meet other disciples and disciplemakers in Europe.

*Let us continue to bear the couple up in prayer as they continue the great work in Europe.*

By God's grace, I am running about four discipleship classes currently. One of my earlier disciples, Destiny, is also running a discipleship class in Pennsylvania.

# NATIONAL SERVICE PERSONNEL IN MISSIONS

LEAVING A GODLY LEGACY, IMPACTING SOULS



## HIGHLIGHTS

Last year's NASPIMites were interrupted, but the new batch is on the field by grace. Additionally, three of the NASPIMites from last year saw the hand of the Lord with their work, and decided to extend their service in those communities for some more months. We thank God for His continued impact.

**C**DM National Service Personnel in Missions (CDM-NASPIM) is an initiative which aims to extend discipleship and discipling to Senior High Schools especially in unreached communities.

The program seeks to achieve this by training final year students who are eligible for national service from the various tertiary institutions across the country, in Christlike discipling. With the co-operation of the National Service Secretariat, interested persons after being trained in discipling are posted to Senior High Schools mainly in unreached communities where they would make disciples alongside their duties as national service personnels.

This initiative also aims at supporting the vision of CDM in reaching out to the 19 unreached people groups in Ghana, as the disciples made can return to their tribes and communities and share their faith much more effectively than an outsider ever could.

This year's recruitment was done online through social media platforms due to COVID-19 restrictions. In total, thirty-three (33) people enrolled on the program from the following

tertiary institutions: University of Ghana (Legon), University of Education (Winneba), University of Development Studies, Tamale Technical University, Koforidua Technical University, Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, University of Cape Coast, Ghana Christian University College, and St. Louis College of Education.

Recruits were posted to Senior High Schools in the Bono, Bono East, Ahafo, Ashanti, Northern, North East, Upper East, Upper West, Volta and Oti regions.

Additionally, three (3) of those who served in NASPIM last year felt led to continue working in their communities. These are Grace Adamu, George Gmalanki, and Cephas Ako. We want to congratulate them for taking the step of faith to continue their work as missionaries.

We strongly encourage disciples and discipling who are eligible for Ghana's National Service programme to prayerfully consider serving on CDM's NASPIM programme. You will not only be helped to grow your personal spiritual life, but you will also become a tool the Lord can use for His work in the places where darkness still reigns.

## FEATURED TESTIMONY

### *Life Before CDM*

My name is Samuel, and I come from a family where everyone is a traditional believer. My mother's children kept getting sick and dying, so she went to seek a child from one of the big altars in our community. About a year later, I was born, and so she gave me the name of the altar, Ntime. This was my original name, until one day, a man of God was passing by and told them to start calling me Samuel. That was how my name changed.

I was baptized by sprinkling as an infant, and again by pouring in a Catholic Church in 2019. I however worshipped the altar I was named after for about twenty-one years, and I was deep in sin. I was sleeping with about seven different girls. I caused an abortion with one of them. I was masturbating, and I was even sleeping with the little kids in the house that I live in. I followed my older brother to various shrines, offering many sacrifices and doing rituals just to be successful in life.

This was the life I was living before I went to the CDM Bible College in Zebilla.

### *After CDM*

During the teachings at the Bible School, I realized that my baptisms had not been done properly. I agreed and was baptized by immersion during the practical sessions. That night, a man appeared to me in my dreams, and told me to read Matt. 24:4-10. After reading the passage, I wept all night from 12:00 to 5:00am.

At the end of the week, we all returned to our various homes in the Upper East region. Three days later, I was disturbed that I still hadn't been baptized in the Holy Spirit. Again, I had a dream in which a man appeared and asked me to read Acts 1-7. I soon received the gift of speaking in tongues, but people didn't understand and they started calling me a mad person. But I was not discouraged. This gave me the assurance that the Lord was with me. I gave myself a target to win the soul of the first person I speak with about the Gospel.

Since then, I testify to the glory of God that He has been using me in my community, even to minister to Christians who have fallen away from the faith and are living in sin. By God's grace, I am able to answer difficult questions which they ask me, and God continues to reveal marvelous things to me in my dreams.

I can see the wonderful change He has brought about in my people's lives and I am still speaking to whoever He brings my way, for that is the work God gave me. God bless CDM.



## NASPIM PROGRESS REPORT

### *NASPIM Training*

Two main training sessions were organized for participants: a one-week CDMBC session in Zebilla which is in the Upper East region, and a two-week online session. There will be subsequent training sessions in due course.

### *Challenges*

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, recruitment was not carried out effectively as compared to previous years where we could go to the various campuses and speak in person to the students. This time round, we were mainly restricted to online advertisements.

Again, quite a number of NASPIM participants are yet to begin active service since the schools where some of these participants have been posted are yet to resume fully due to COVID-19. So far, the total number of SHS students being discipled are 12. Once again, this is partly due to the absence

of students from school as a result of COVID-19. Numbers are expected to increase once schools resume fully come next year.

Also, not all NASPIM participants were able to partake in the training due to transportation issues with regard to the training in Zebilla and technological challenges with regard to the online training session.

### *Strategies for the Way Forward*

NASPIM participants, especially those who have not been trained yet, will be enrolled in upcoming CDM Bible College sessions.

Also, there will be a monthly monitoring and evaluation system put in place, to measure and enhance fruitfulness in discipling. This will be accompanied by occasional visits to the various fields of posting, to be facilitated by NASPIM representatives.

## NASPIM REPORT: WA



God has been very good to us in the field of work since we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them (Eph. 2:10).

We have a total of 24 disciples on the UDS campus at Wa. We meet them in three different groups based on location: British Cottage, Royal Hall, and Bamahu.

Before we were interrupted by the COVID-19, we had finished discussing discipleship, new birth, and water baptism.

During the period when the schools closed down, we were not able to meet effectively because

although we tried online meetings, some of the students are located in places where there are serious network challenges. However, about seven (7) of them are located in areas where we have been able to use Whatsapp for discipleship. With these, we have finished discussing the 4 Experiences, and are only left with the practical ministrations. Hopefully, that will be done when school resumes next year.

Besides the students on campus, we have household meetings at Samuel's house in Bamahu (7 people) and Rebecca's house at Kumpala (5 people) on Thursday and Friday evenings respectively.

Glory to God that CDM Bible College was organized in Wa, and has come to stay to train and impact souls for God's kingdom.



## NASPIM REPORT: CEPHAS AKO (ANLOGA, VR)



*Cephias Ako serves in Zion College (ZICO) at Anloga in the Volta Region.*

At ZICO, I disciple Form 3A and B Business classes. We meet on Saturdays, and currently have about 37 students at our meetings. About 7 students from other classes also join in.

In Form 2, I currently disciple almost all the students with the exception of a few classes. I use the library periods of each class to do that.

In Form 1, I disciple Business A and B, General Arts B, C, E and H.

In the main Anloga town, I am discipling about 26 people. We meet in one of their homes on Fridays and Mondays. I was also recently able to have a conference with a section of my disciples from Anloga, Keta, Sogakofe, Ho, Accra and Cape Coast, to get them to know each other and discuss their challenges and suggestions for the way forward.

I bless God for His breakthroughs.





## NASPIM REPORT: GEORGE GMALANKI (DUCCIE)

*George Gmalanki serves in Duccie and the Chakali communities in the Upper East region of Ghana.*

I have a total number of thirty (30) stable disciples. I meet them in various discipleship groups depending on their academic level and background. There are ten of them in Senior High School, fifteen of them in JHS/Primary, and five of them who are workers or at the higher levels of education.

By God's grace, we have also been involved in church planting. The Gurumbelle church has twenty members for now who have been water baptized by immersion.

Finally, we have a house fellowship (church) which is made up of about fifty members. We give God all the glory for His impact in the region.



# NASPIM REPORT: GRACE ADAMU (NAVRONGO)

*Grace Adamu serves in Navrongo and its surrounding communities in the Upper East region of Ghana.*

By God's grace, I have been holding discipleship classes in the Navrongo SHS, as well as classes in Wiaga-Sandema and in the Navrongo community. We have also been able to go out for evangelism and started small fellowship groups in Ganne, Kapania, and Punyuro (Navrongo communities).

We are particularly grateful that we could organize and hold the CDMBC Zebilla with 35 participants, out of whom 13 were baptized.

We thank God for keeping us safely on the field and opening doors for ministry. We are also grateful to the CDM leadership for their support and prayers, as well as the whole CDM family for finances, prayers, and all kinds of support. God bless you, and keep praying with us.

# REPORT: FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION AND DISBURSEMENT

A 3-member team was established to handle the management, disbursement, and reporting of the income received through the partnership program in order to enhance transparency. Upon discussion, it was agreed that the income from the program would be distributed proportionally across the following categories:

- **Administration**

Money to be used for administrative purchases and purposes, registration materials for participants, preparing the site for CDM programs, preparing CDM materials, and facilitating other tasks of CDM Admin.

- **Maintenance**

Money to subsidize the payment of recurrent bills incurred at the CDM Retreat Center, and pay for the maintenance and upkeep for minor repairs of damages to the infrastructure.

- **Charity (Scholarships and Training)**

Money set aside to fund Missions Bible Colleges across the country and fuel the provision of scholarships to the worthy but needy disciples of trusted disciplinarians. For now, Mr Kofi Osew oversees the allocation of scholarships.

- **Savings**

Money set aside as savings that may be used as a buffer when income is insufficient.

- **CDM Bible Colleges**

Money to fund especially Satellite Bible Colleges around the world, and support the movement of facilitators, disciples, and materials.

- **CDM Retreats**

Money to support especially Satellite CDM Retreats around the world, and support the movement of facilitators, disciples, and materials.

- **Salaries and Wages**

Money to consistently pay our salaried workers (currently 2 caretakers and a new worker in Wa).

- **Facilitator Support**

Money to support facilitator training, honorarium, and encouragement through socialization programs.

- **NASPIM**

Money to fund NASPIM-related activities, and personnel on the field, as well as support the movement of pastoral visitation and mobilization teams.

- **Discipleship Meetings**

Money to support movement of disciples and disciplinarians to various discipleship meeting venues.

- **Travel Expenses**

Money to support the travel costs of CDM members and other helpers.

- **Printing and Communication**

Money to fund the costs of printing and communication.

These categories, as well as the allocated proportion of income, are subject to change as CDM grows and/or the need arises.

One of the greatest advantages of this system has been that money allocated to a particular category remains in the category's coffers and can be carried forward for future heavy expenses. Meanwhile, categories that outspend their allocation can be supported with money from some of the buffer categories.

We are grateful to God for this wisdom.





### MINISTRY MONTHS

CDM remains committed to equipping church members to identify and use their spiritual gifts and talents to expand the kingdom of God.

In line with this, the following months have been assigned to the various ministries for activities related to the development and growth of the particular gift, including Ministry Academies, outreaches, etc.

We strongly encourage all CDMites to take advantage of these opportunities to grow their gifts so they can be of more use wherever they are.

- Evangelistic Ministry: January and July
- Pastoral/Shepherding Ministry: February and August
- Teaching Ministry: March and September
- Prophetic Ministry: April and October
- Apostolic Ministry: May and November

### CDM BIBLE COLLEGES

The task of preparing the Body of Christ for the Second Coming and training every Christian to be a fruitful disciplemaker can only be accomplished when we equip the average believer with the basic truths of Scripture. CDM Bible Colleges will run in full force to reach this goal.

The Residential sessions at Ayi-Mensah will be held in January, May, and August, while the Online Bible School (E-CDMBC) will run in March, June, and October.

Satellite and Missions Bible Schools will be organized by the various co-ordinators and communicated as they are coming up.

## CDM ANNUAL RETREATS

CDM Retreats are an opportunity to check on the quantity and quality of our disciplinarians and disciples. We also give attendants a chance to visit spiritual clinics. They are un-missable in equipping and assessing those in the movement to make Christlike disciplinarians. This is why we encourage every disciplinarian affiliated with CDM who is available to make it for the retreats.

The Quality Control retreat will come off in February, and the Major Retreat will be in August.

As we attempt to decentralize disciplinarianing, we also hope to see more regional/zonal retreats, like the CDM Akosombo and CDM SA retreats of 2020.

### NASPIM

The National Service Personnel in Missions (NASPIM) initiative is critical in our strategy to reach unreached tribes with the Gospel through existing structures God has made available.

The NASPIMites for the 2021 year have been deployed, but our doors are always open for applicants willing to be trained and sent for one year at least.

### TEACHING MINISTRY YEAR-ROUND MENTORING

The fivefold ministry is Jesus' wisdom for equipping the Church to perfection. CDM will not take it for granted.

In 2021, the Teaching Ministry is rolling out a special programme for comprehensive training in the ministry. While 2021 will focus on a few selected people as a pilot session, we look forward to raising Christlike Bible teachers who are solid pillars of truth for the generations ahead.



In March, the Teaching Ministry will also hold a Ministry Academy which is open to the public.

### FINISHING THE TASK PRAYER

Prayer is the indispensable fuel that pushes God's agenda through on the earth. World evangelism, missions, and all the activities of CDM and other organizations involved in the business of saving souls can only thrive when believers pray.

In order to finish the task of world evangelism, CDM has constituted a Monitoring and Evaluation Team whose purpose is to plan, monitor, and evaluate the assignment of finishing the task world evangelism. After these years, we keep seeing the need for strategic approaches to the task.

We have therefore created a number of positions to oversee the task. Any CDMite who feels called along these lines can contact Aps. JFK Mensah or Enoch Randy Aikins to be a part of this work.

# JOB DESCRIPTIONS FOR CDM POSITIONS

## *General Qualifications*

- Must have graduated from CDM Bible College and be a yearly disciplemaker.
- Must be committed to the 7 core values of CDM
- Must have passion for finishing the task of the Great Commission
- Must choose his assistant & build his own supervision team of not more than 5 CDM disciplemakers.
- Accountable to the CDM Evaluation Team & CDM President.
- Takes direct orders from the CDM Evaluation Team and works together with the team to solve problems.

**Term:** Duration of office is 3 years' renewable.

### *1. Disciplemaker Chief Whip/Taskmaster*

- a. Must ensure that every registered CDM disciplemaker produces at least one quality disciplemaker per year or is dropped from the active list.
- b. Must constantly supervise the recruiting, growth and registration of approved CDM Disciplemakers

### *2. Team for Building a System for Recording Disciples/Disciplemakers*

- a. This team is to take care of building and maintaining the registration system (Disciplemakers app) for recording the discipleship relationships of all CDM disciples and disciplemakers.

Without this list, it will be impossible to measure our progress, quality of disciples, and the number of disciples at any one time.

### *3. Team for Monitoring & Improving Quality of Disciples/Disciplemakers*

- a. This team is in charge of monitoring, evaluating and improving the quality of disciples and disciplemakers in CDM.
- b. Must devise controls and feedback systems for inspecting individual disciples and disciplemakers.

- c. Must alert leadership of poor quality disciples and disciplemakers, and assist in taking appropriate action to correct errors.

- d. Must expose doctrinal and character flaws in Disciplemakers for necessary discipline

Without this team, the quality of Christlike disciplmaking may fall without our notice.

### *4. CDM Continental/Regional/Sub-Regional/Country Coordinator*

- a. This team has the responsibility of discipling the continent/region/sub-region or country of choice.


- b. Must build a team of those passionate for seeing the continent disciplined and filled with Bible Schools and Bible-believing churches.

- c. Must work with the Holy Spirit to determine the countries with ripe harvest

- d. Must determine the localities in which to start Bible schools, disciplmaking and church-planting movements

- e. The country coordinators shall serve under and report to the Sub-Regional Coordinator, who in turn shall report to the Regional Coordinator. The Regional Coordinator shall also serve under and report to the Continental Coordinator

Without discipling the continents, we can never finish the task of the Great Commission. The countries, tribes, people groups, and languages of each continent must be disciplined individually



A person applying for any of these positions must be a resident in the continent/regional/sub-regional or country in which he or she is applying for to be a Coordinator. Despite this, a person who is not a resident of the intended location can apply and shall be considered for the position if he or she demonstrates adequate commitment to faithfully discharge his or her duties as the Coordinator of that location

#### **5. CDM Campus Coordinator - Teams for Tertiary & Secondary Institutions**

- a. This team shall be responsible for discipling the tertiary and secondary campuses.
- b. Must build a team of those passionate for discipling the campuses, and recruiting laborers for the harvest.
- c. Campus coordinators shall serve and be accountable to the CDM Country Coordinator

This is critical for recruiting the manpower for cross-cultural missions and the future leadership of the body of Christ

#### **6. CDM 5-fold Ministry Coordinators**

- a. Each Ministry Coordinator shall choose his own assistant and build his ministry team for service to CDM and the global Body of Christ.
- b. Must be an active Christlike disciplemaker who is also a biblical example of Apostle, Bible teacher, Prophet, Evangelist, Shepherd.

c. Must raise teachers and facilitators for the CDM Ministry Academy

d. Must prepare a syllabus for teaching/training new members to the maturity level for Certificate and Diploma in the Ministry beginning from 2021.

We can never present disciples who are mature to the fullness of the stature of Christ without a solid input from the five-fold ministry (Eph. 4:11-13).

#### **7. CDM Gender/Age Ministries Coordinators**

a. The coordinators of these Ministries - Men, Women, Youth, Junior Youth, Children, Aged - shall choose their own assistants and build their local, national, continental, teams to serve their geographical area. Age- and Gender-specific discipling shall be their responsibility.


b. Must prepare a syllabus for teaching/training/building Christlike character specific to each of these age and gender ministries to the maturity level for Certificate and Diploma beginning 2021

c. Must be an active Christlike disciplemaker who serves as example of Man, Woman, Youth, Senior Citizen, etc.

d. Must build a team to start a disciple-making movement among his age/gender

e. Must raise teachers and facilitators for the CDM Ministry Academy

This role is critical to ensure the various age and gender-specific ministries are disciplined and presented perfect in Christ.
