Updates from the Field

Damongo (Gonja People Group)

Missionaries Wilson Ametorworbla and Jerome Kuma continued their work among the Gonja and Kamara people groups. Early in the year, 39 individuals heard the Gospel, and six surrendered their lives to Christ. Through hospital evangelism and discipleship programs in secondary schools, churches, and home cells, a strong foundation of believers was established. By the second half of the year, another 20 people were reached, and 61 disciples had been raised. Testimonies of healing and the growing house church movement reflect the impact of the Gospel in this region.

Chakali (Katua and Tisa Communities)

Among the Chakali people, missionaries Balamo Matere and Kokube Emmanuel led evangelistic crusades and home discipleship meetings. Six house churches were planted in Katua, and three more in Yaala. Through persistent evangelism, 29 souls surrendered to Christ, and 16 baptisms took place. The work extended into Kulung and Tisa, where five new house churches were birthed.

Wale Wale (Mamprusi People Group)

The mission among the Mamprusi people experienced tremendous breakthroughs. Missionaries Emmanuel and Florence Bentil reached over 1,000 students in school outreaches, leading to 87 salvations and 22 rededications in the first half of the year. In the second half, 1,530 more heard the Gospel, with 69 responding in faith and 21 receiving baptism. An Easter convention in Zandoa, a newly planted church, and discipleship programs in multiple schools strengthened the faith of many. Among the testimonies are how the Chief of Bugsa surrendered his life to Christ, and a Muslim woman's vision of Jesus led to her salvation.

Wa (Wala People Group)

Missionaries Abu Sunnaya Suleman and Jennifer Gyameah Nkrumah engaged in consistent outreach among the Wala people. Through evangelism at Loho and Charia communities and devotions at vocational institutions, 32 people gave their lives to Christ.

The discipleship group at WA Senior High Technical grew to 17 members, and many testified of their spiritual growth.

Nanumba (Wulensi Region – Nanumba People Group)

Missionaries Mr. and Mrs. Ahedor faithfully labored among the Nanumba people, nurturing 35 active disciples through prayer and fasting. Outreach partnerships with Assemblies of God churches led to 30 people hearing the Gospel in the first half of the year. By year-end, 11 more had come to faith, with testimonies of miraculous healings, including a family delivered from repeated miscarriages.

Chereponi (Anoufo Chokossi People Group)

In Chereponi, missionaries Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Mensah saw 27 people give their lives to Christ in the first half of the year, and three received Holy Spirit baptism. By year-end, the mission had grown to 16 active disciples, with five deliverances and three baptisms.

More Updates from the Field

Zebilla (Busanga People Group)

Missionary Nicholas Akumasi reached the Busanga people through market evangelism and discipleship efforts. Early in the year, four souls responded to the Gospel, and by year-end, 40 new believers had been won, with discipleship ongoing in Gumyoko.

Tatale (Sanguli District – Konkomba People Group)

The Konkomba people of Tatale witnessed a great move of God as 14 churches were planted in 14 communities during the first half of the year. Missionaries Rev. Dominic Malintiba and Bro. John Yaati Nanyila continued strengthening the believers, and by year-end, 40 individuals had given their lives to Christ, with 17 receiving baptism. An Easter convention also commissioned five deacons and six deaconesses to assist in pastoral work.

Yabraso (Banda Ligbi People Group)

Among the Banda Ligbi people, missionary Mary Tuogali led evangelistic efforts that saw 103 salvations in the first half of the year and 242 more in the second half. Discipleship programs spread across multiple communities and schools, leading to deep transformation. A major testimony is of the deliverance of a disciple's father from a severe addiction to smoking.

Nigeria Missions

Missionaries Akuban Emmanuel and Joshua Duncan engaged in street evangelism, house-to-house ministry, and outreach to ghettos, reaching 135 individuals in the first half of the year and 71 more by year-end. A total of 65 souls were won, and discipleship efforts continued at LASUSTECH (Lagos State University of Science and Technology). A police station in Shiwama has also granted permission for the Gospel to be shared with officers and prisoners.

General Testimonies and Updates

- Nine motorcycles were distributed to missionaries, improving mobility in remote areas.
- Three missionary couples were blessed with children.
- Healing miracles, including deliverance from epilepsy and breakthroughs for families, were recorded across various mission fields.

Prayer Needs

In this new year, we ask for prayers in the following areas:

- Strength for new believers to remain firm in their faith despite opposition.
- More discipleship leaders to be raised to sustain and expand the work.
- Open doors for ministry in schools and communities still resistant to the Gospel.
- Provision of resources like motorcycles, Bibles, and discipleship materials.
- Protection for missionaries working in challenging and hostile environments.

"And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come." – Matthew 24:14


Financial Overview


Average Monthly Income: GHS 49, 695
